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

Catch a small boat to view the pods of hippos and abundan birdlife that Naivasha is so farmous for, then back at the lodge enjoy a delicious leisurely lunch and relaxing swim in the pool before returning to Nairobi in the late afternoon.

Venture into the bush with her son, who will explain what it's like being a young warrior in Maasai society, sit with the elders as they share their stories of their fascinating culture, and learn from the women how to make some traditional descrative beaded jewellery.

Your final day will be spent relaxing at leisure, giving you the opportunity to reflect on the amazine experiences over the past few days as you fondly remember the warm and welcoming, and fascinating and inspirational Kenyan people you have met and connected with. 

### Day 1

#### The Inspirations of One Woman

Today we drive to a developing area in the west of Nairobi and visit the Women's Empowerment Centre, which is one of the worthwhile projects One Horizon supports. It was started by Mary a social worker, who developed a program to help struggling mothers undertake vocational and lifestyle training and get access to micro finance to open small businesses. The results have been phenomenal as the mothers are able to lift themselves out of poverty and transform into independent business owners and community leaders, and crucially support and keep their families together. Spend time with Mary to learn about her vision for the centre while you get the opportunity to meet some of the proud and self-sufficient women involved in the inspirational program.



### **New Beginnings for Grandmas**

There are many grandmother-headed households in Kenya who care for their grandchildren among other generations of their family in difficult economic circumstances. You will visit a pig farm owned by one grandmother where she proudly explains pig-husbandry and how her bio-gas system powers her home. This is another project that One Horizon supports, and the initiative aims at improving the livelihoods of the grandmothers by economically empowering them through small-scale farming. Then sit down with the grandmothers while they cook traditional meals for their families and narrate their wonderful stories of life, change and prooress.

### Day 3

#### The Maasai Rites of Passage

Spend an amazing day with the warriors and women of a traditional Maasai village. It starts with a song and dance welcome where the wife of a village elder will offer to dress you in traditional Maasai shuka cloth or 'African blanket'. Venture into the bush with her son, who will explain what it's like being a young warrior in Maasai society, and join other men who are training for their rite of passage as they explain how they will go into the hills to complete qualifying tasks before they reach the circumcision ceremony. Take part in the challenge as they show you how to throw a spear and climb an acacia tree in lightning speed. Sit with the villagers as they share their stories of their fascinating culture with you while the women teach you how to make some traditional descorative beaded jewellery.



### Day 1

### Maasai Family Ties

Today you drive to an authentic Maasai village on the autskirts of Nairobi where you spend the day with the men, women and children, and one of the elders, Daniel, will take you on a tour to explain how the Maasai have managed these precious lands for centuries. Spend time with Maasai mothersand help them build a new manyatta – a traditional Maasai homestead, while Maasai warriors will teach ancient skills such as spear-throwing and how to use local plants to make medicinal remedies, and will invite you to join them as they herd their cattle. In the afternoon the women will share their stories as they help you make your own piece of traditional beautifully-crafted beaded Maasai jewellery. You will discover that they are just as interested in your life as you are in theirs, as you join in the singing and dancing, and share the humour and warm nature of the villagers.



#### Kikuvu Family Ties

Theré are many grandmother-headed households in Kenya that care for a number of generations, and today you are hosted by gracious grandmother Hellen at her rural home, who will introduce you to her large Kikuyu family. She will show you around her innovative pig farm, and you can pitch in with the chores if you'd like to. This is a project supported by One Horizon as an initiative to improve the livelihoods of grandmothers by economically empowering them through small-scale farming. Helen earns a sustainable income from the pigs, while the bio-gas system from the waste powers her home. You also help to cook a traditional Kenyan lunch and share it with some of the other grandmothers in the community. Enjoy some joyful singing and dancing, and you will be inspired by listening to their powerful stories of life, change and progress and how the program has helped keep their families toaether.

You will be invited to become an honorary member of the Massai, and learn how to throw a warrior's spear, create decorative jewellery, and join in their wibrant singing and dancing. It's a wonderful opportunity to gain an insight into Kenyan rural life and share and listen to stories and beliefs with individuals from a completely different word and culture.

### Day 1

### Become an Honorary Maasai

Begin the day with a drive into the magnificent Maasai heartland where you will be met by one of the Maasai village elders, Daniel. He will take you on a tour to explain how the Maasai have managed these precious lands for centuries, and you watch the daily cattle drive and learn about some of the local plants used to make medicinal remedies. Then sit down with some young Maasai warriors, or morans, who describe various aspects of their fascinating rites of passage, and who will teach you how to throw a traditional spear or even how to climb an acacia thorn tree in the event there is danger from predators in the bush. In the afternoon you will spend some time with the Maasai women of the village who will show you the techniques of weaving the frame of a new manyatta – a traditional Maasai homestead.



### Day 2

#### Maasai Life in Focus

Begin the day back at the village by learning the traditional Maasai welcome with singing and dancing, which might include the extraordinary jumping dance, or 'adumu' which is how Maasai warriors demonstrate their prowess. Your host for the day has 52 siblings and his father has 6 wives; a starkly different kind of community structure to the one we are familiar with. Use the time to get to know your host and ask the questions you might have, and enjoy the humour and warm nature of the villagers as you discover that they are just as interested in your life as you are in theirs. After a traditional Maasai lunch, you enjoy some more dance lessons and sit with the women to learn how to make some traditional beaded jewellery, and then head out to help some of the community members finish the manyatta build.

### Day 2

### Senior citizens raising their grandchildren

This day is all about meeting some amazing grandmas who live in a society where grandchildren are often left in their care. A cultural tour in Africa and Kenya specifically which is changing the face of tourism

And in a society where social security benefits are not part of life, the challenges to educate and feed youngsters can often be overwhelming. But these grandmas are resilient and unstoppable. And their efforts as entrepreneurs have helped them forge a brighter future. And it's their stories that will amaze you.

The journeys of these women have covered their early years in colonial East Africa (as Kenya used to be known) to the current day. Incarceration in camps confronted them in their earliest years and life was a daily struggle. Some were fortunate to go to school whilst others missed out completely. And along came marriage and children which threw up a lot of challenges. And the perspective of their lives is in context to where they have ended up today and what they make of their past experiences. A day which will leave you rivetted.









### Day 3

#### Maasai families copina with change

On day 3, you find yourself in a Maasai village that includes revered elders, married women and young men. It's set in a village less than an hour from downtown Nairobi in a picturesque village surrounded by the Naona Hills.

Their challenges are about navigating their changing world. It's becoming increasingly harder to maintain their life of customs and rituals. And for a society that are passionate about their culture this is particularly challenging. No longer are they able to hunt lions or practice century old traditions associated with rites of passage. Yet with their great sense of humour and English language skills, the discussions are fascinating, beguilling and emotional. There is a lat of faughter along the way.

This is an amazing day and you can be assured that your Maasai hosts will want to know as much about you as you do about them. They define cultural tours in Africa.



### Day 4

### Single mothers striving to keep their families together

On day 4 you will meet young mothers who are raising a family's whilst at the same time gaining new vocational skills. The skills program equips the women to be able to earn a living so that they can support them. It's been a tough road to this point but the vocational centre is a place of hope, hard work and inspiration.

The young mothers are focussed on what they need to do and enjoy the discussions with their peer group and others. The discussions are often about how to work through difficulties and emerge into a better situation. It's a respite centers where the women can heal and learn from each other. Empowerment is the theme and this is the begaining of a new future for the women.

The woman are eager to hear of other people's stories and the challenge we all face trying to bring up children where there are many demands. Its sharing the information from which they draw strength and over a cup of tea and homemade lunch you can aurantee a lot of lauahter and happiness as well.



### Day 5

### Families navigating life

On day 5 you will visit a centre for families and it's a great way to meet the locals. And the locals drop in because the centre provides peer support and meals each day to help them get through tough times.

The centre is a beehive of activity and it acts as a day out for many families who toil in the search for work. You will meet amazing people who have a quiet determination to succeed. 

### Day 1

#### Visitina Karen Blixen's Home

The home of Karen Blixen was the centre and one of the largest coffee plantations of its era in Kenya. Her home in the suburb that carries her name, is now a museum showcasing her life. The original property covered 6,000 acres (2,400 ha) of land: 600 acres (240 ha) were used for a coffee plantation, 3,400 acres (1,400 ha) were used by the natives for grazing, and 2,000 acres (810 ha) of virgin forest were left untouched.

Karen and her husband became convinced that coffee would be profitable.] The Karen Coffee Company was established by their uncle, Aage Westerholz, who chose the name after his daughter Karen, Blixen's cousin, rather than to create an association with Karen Blixen. The coffee plantation was untimely unsuccessful and as Karen's marriage crumbled, she ultimately took over the management of the plantation.



Karen Blixen was an internationally acclaimed author whose pen name was Isak Dinesen and who chronicled her 17 years in Kenya in her autobiographical book, Out of Africa (published in 1937). She had spent from 1914 to 1931 in British East Africa and her story was made famous in the same named movie over 50 years later.

Karen Blixen was a Baroness who gained the title after marrying Baron Bror Blixen-Finecke in Mombasa in 2014. She was nominated for a Noble Prize in Literature several times. Two of her books Babettes Feast' and Out of Africa were made into Hollywood movies to critical acclaim. She was also a very well-known and talented critist as well.

Karen left Kenya in 1931 not long after dealing with the loss of her lover Denys but also the failure of her coffee plantation. She remained inexplicably linked to the country and the Ngong Hills. As a recent commentary states "Karen's unbearable longing for Africa, her farm and her employees never faltered through all the long years since. In a letter to her mother, she wrote: 'I have a feeling that wherever I may be in the future, I will be wondering whether there is rain at Ngong.'

On the 7th of September 1962: Karen Blixen died after a long illness at her family home in Denmark. And quoting from Nicky Fitzgerald, "All she owned of Africa, a handful of earth she'd brought back with her to Denmark in a little wooden box, was mixed with the soil of Rungstedlund in her grave. The unadorned tombstone of Isak Dinesen, the world-famous author, is inscribed simply 'Karen Blixen." It was one of the most moving places I have ever visited."














In a letter to her brother Thomas in 1924, Karen Blixen wrote: "I believe that for all time and eternity I am bound to Denys, to love the ground he walks upon, to be happy beyond words when he is here, and to suffer worse than death many times when he leaves..." Denys Finch Hatton was a big game hunter and entrepreneur, who flew his own plane and had a reputation for an adventurous and daring life. He was the epitome of the colonial period. And he was flying his plane when it crashed in Vol near Mombasa. The manner of his death only added to his reputation as an adventurer with a great jest for life. He had expressed a desire to be buried in the same place that Karen had planned for herself in the Ngong Hills. It was Karen Blixen who craanised his burial.

Karen Blixen and Denys Finch Hatton had been part of a group of ex-pats known for their wealth and lifestylle. They merely epitomised a period when East Africa was the playground for royalty, titled and wealthy. It offered an escape or as Karen Blixen wrote, "Here at long last one was in a position not to give a damn for all conventions, here was a new kind of freedom which until then one had only found in dreams!" Denys Finch Hatton had come from a titled English family and the current titles continue in his family to this day. On the 14th of May 1931, Denys perished in an air crash and is buried, as he wished, in the Ngang Hills. Karen Blixen had him interred at their 'sopecial olace'.

### The Final Restina Place

As Karen noted in her biography "There was a place in the Hills, on the first ridge in the Game Reserve, that I, myself at the time when I thought that I was to live and die in Africa, had pointed out to Denys as my future buriol-place. In the evening, while we set and looked at the hills from my house, he remarked that then he would like to be buried there himself as well. Since then, sametimes when we drove out in the hills. Denys had said: "Let us drive as far as our graves."

In 1974 his British family erected the obelisk in his memory and visit Kenya regularly – honouring their son, brother, and uncle.



#### Visiting Ngong Hills Which Karen Loved

Ngong Hills, which Karen's coffee plantation skirted, was a source of great pleasure for Karen Blixen as well as Denys Finch Hatton.

The Ngong Hills is an area of great beauty and it was a place that she retreated to offen. It was a source of inspiration to Karen Blixen because of its sheer beauty and the diversity of its flora and fauna. And it was the place that she chose, and which was supposed to be, her final resting place. Denys Finch Hotton also endorsed the same place to be with Karen. The magnificent vistas dominate the landscape as much today as they did in Karen and Deny's day.

And on this excursion, we take you to the peak of the Ngong Hills to stand in the same place where Karen stood and to see the same amazing valley's and hills that she loved so much. You will be as inspired as Karen was. And it's also a photo opportunity to recreate the same amazing scenes that were so beautifully captured in the movie. A lifetime memory!

### Visiting A Maasai Elder Who Became an Extra Hollywood Comes To Ngong Hills

Less than 20 minutes from the vista which you will enjoy is an adjacent valley that is part of the Ngong Hills. It is another magical place of extreme beauty but where acacia trees dominate in a traditional African landscape.

Driving through the foothills our destination is to meet up with a Maasai elder who was in several scenes that were shot for the film. The arrival of Hollywood, with all the supporting crew and activity involved many of the locals. And the scenes were shot less than 1000 yards from where your Maasai hosts live. A picturesque valler what epitomises the beauty of Africa.

Your Maasai host was, at the time, not aware of such things as movies, let alone the industry of acting and Hollywood. But remembering the support crew and stars that interacted with the local Maasai stands out in his memory. Your host will tell you fascinating stories of his interaction with the stars. And he became, unknowingly, an extra in a movie that became known for its incredible depiction of the beauty of Africa.



### The Wildlife Scenes that Enthralled The World

# Kenyan women turning their lives around

We drive you to a developing area in Ngong to the west of Nairobi, and take in sights such as the eclectic Ngong Road markets where you can buy anything and everything.

Then you visit the Women's Empowerment Centre, where One Horizon supports an IB-month program to help struggling mothers undertake skills training and get access to microfinance to open small businesses. Not so long ago these marginalised women had very little hope, few resources, and no support, and many are HIV-positive and have suffered discrimination and been ostracized by their own husbands and families and were forced into homelessness.

You will walk away from the experience of meeting these determined and resourceful women, with much admiration and a new perspective on how teaching empowerment skills can lift people out of poverty.





Our first stop is the African Fund for Endangered Wildlife's famous Giraffe Centre, which has pioneered an innovative breeding programme to grow the population of the endangered Rothschild giraffe in the wild.


You'll meet the giraffes at eye level from the centre's raised walkway, and get a comprehensive education about how we can all play a role in the conservation of habitats and the preservation of wildlife. We then go the short distance to the elephant orphanage at the Sheldrick Wildlife Trust on the edge of Nairobi National Park.





The trust has hand-reared hundreds of baby elephants that have been orphaned, often due to injury and poaching, and rereleased them back into the wild in Tsavo National Park. You'll learn more about this fascinating venture and see the baby elephants being fed by their keepers.

You then spend an engaging afternoon in the rural homes of Kenyan grandmothers, who are remarkable and inspirational women that have taken on the responsibility of caring for their grandchildren and extended families. You'll look around a pig farm where a grandmother proudly explains pig-husbandry and how her bio-gas system powers her home; an initiative supported by One Horizon and the involvement of travellers like your selves that aims at improving the livelihoods of the grandmothers by economically empowering them through small-scale farming. Then sit down with the grandmothers while they cook traditional meals and narrate their powerful stories about how the program has helped them run a sustainable business that keeps their families together.







You are picked up from your ladgings by One Horizon and you embark on a short 25-milout vehicle journey to the rural outskirts of Nairobi. Along the way you will see aspects of both traditional life and the development in modern infrastructure that has dominated the last few years of Kenya. But all this quickly recedes as you enter the rural hinterland outside Nairobi and leave the hustle and bustle of the city behind you.

Upon arriving at Mama Carole's home, you will be greeted with the warmth and spontaneity of Carole and her family. And to the beat of African drums your welcome embraces the excitement that occasions your arrival. And after a welcoming song and dance from your host, it's time to enjoy the day and all that comes with it.

In addition to being shown around her home, you will soon begin the first part of learning about Kenyan food, by helping to prepare and cook chapathis. Chapathis are similar to flat bread are a great Kenyan tradition and favourite. In many Kenyan families, chapathis are prepared only once a year and usually during the Xmas season. It's a great introduction to Kenyan life. You will also experience the use of biogas which provides the fuel that is produced in an energy efficient source from her farm.






The chapatitis are then taken over a cup of Kenyan tea and/or coffee as a starter for the day. And during this time, Mama Carol will explain her life's journey and that of her 5 children – the achievements and the obstacles which she has navigated so far. It's a fascinating insight into the life of a citizen of Kenya women.

After this, it's time to undertake the preparation for lunch and being taught the skills of making a fresh Kenyan vegetable stew drawn from the farm veggie garden. It's an entirely organic and healthy lunch and one which is favoured by many Kenyan families (and you will be supplied with the recipe as part of your day).

One of the most fascinating aspects in the cooking of your lunch is that it is done over a 3 stone fire. That is, a Irraditional lunch cooked over an open fire. It's the most common form of cooking food in Kenya. It's all about cultural immersion on this day and a day which you will remember for ever as the cooking is interrupted by song and dance that is so much part of Kenya. A day which you will never forget and one which enables you to be able to make great nutritious food as memento when you get home. A memory which you can relive with you newfound Kenyan cooking skills

#### Build a home the Maasai way

Your One Horizon guide will pick you up from your hotel for a scenic hour-long journey to a Maasai village in the hills around Kiserian, a settlement in the Great Rift Valley southwest of Nairobi


You will be introduced to the elder Maasai women who will be supervising the day's events and will also meet the women of the family whose home you will be helping to build. Over a cup of delicious Kenyan tea, they will share with you what it's like to live in a village, Maasai tribal values and how the Maasai manage their environment.





Once we're all acquainted, it's time to get stuck into your project for the day—building a manyatta. You'll be shown all the skills that are required including how to replicate the intricate weave of the branches, sticks, and thatch, and make walls and ceilings out of mud. These instructions are very special as you will see and take part in traditional home-making skills that have survived for centuries and are passed down through generations.

After also building up an appetite, enjoy a hearty lunch of local ugali, (a maize flour porridge), vegetables and fruit, eaten with your hosts, giving you more time to get to know them and find out more about their way of life and how it might compare to your own. The afternoon continues with the building of the manyatta, and while a home like this can take up to three weeks to build to wait for the materials to properly dry out, you helping the women can reduce this time significantly. Before returning to Nairobi, they will dress you in traditional Maasai-style in a red shuka cloth or 'African blanket' and you will be treated to an infectious display of singing and dancing.

Here you will be invited to visit a village and meet some amazina Maasai women, and in one of the manyattas your host, partly through traditional verse and song will give insight into what being a Maasai woman means, with all its rituals and obligations. You'll also get the opportunity to try some traditional food, join in the infectious singing and dancing, and the women will show you how to make a traditional Maasai beaded wristband to take home with you as a memory of your day.





# Visiting a Self-Reliant

In the afternoon we drive you to a Kikuvu village on the outskirts of Nairobi, where Kenvan arandmas are often responsible for raising their grandchildren and others in their family when parents can no longer look after them. You meet some endearing and entrepreneurial grandmothers who are beating their generational cycle of poverty by operating their own pig farm, which is a project supported by One Horizon to improve their livelihoods by empowering them and providing an income through small-scale farming. Additionally the bio-gas system creates energy out of the waste to power their homes which means that the family no longer has to cut down trees for cooking and heating purposes. Your tour fees and visit support their training, as well as veterinary care and feed for the pigs, and this is a rare opportunity to support a grassroots social enterprise.






experience enables all of us to play a part to reverse, over time, the impact of overgrazing and loss of grazing land and habitats for wildlife that erosion causes.

# A project that aims to plant 10.000 trees

Tree planting is the major activity of the day. In coordination with local Maasai villagers our guests will be helping to plant up to 25 trees per person to help achieve stabilisation of the land from severe erosion. And this is stage 1, where it has been anticipated that 10,000 trees will occupy the site prior to the planning of native Acacia trees found on the African savanna.


The area where the planting takes place is in a valley where, when it rains, massive amounts of water have scoured the land and left huge furrows. The herding Maasai have lost a significant amount of their land. Drainage works by the government is addressing the flow of uncontrolled water, but now it's the community's effort which is required. Planting trees will help stabilise and mitigate the loss of further lands to erosion.





The species of trees which are required has already been identified and the project will progress in stages. On a holiday experience it is unlikely that many people have the opportunity to provide support in such a practical way to an indiagenous community such as the Maasai.

Helping in this endeavour will be young Maasai men and women who One Horizon has employed to dig the holes and to ensure that there is enough water to water the trees. Getting the young Maasai involved also helps build their ownership of the project at the same time as providing an income. And whilst the planting goes on, our Maasai helpers will no doubt be singing and dancing their way through the day. And when we take a break, we will retreat to the village for refreshments and some fun. And that involves demonstrations of some of the skills that the Maasai that helps them navigate their lives.



This unique cultural tour in Kenya is conducted in a village and in a traditional Maasai home (manyatta) under the tutelage of Masai women who support their families through making jewellerv.

The Masai community that you become part of is not a tourist attraction. It is a community that goes about its days doing what the Masai do every day, herding animals. That's why it is one of the most intimate cultural tours which provides insights into Massai life.

Maasai jewellery, which is a distinctive part of the adornment of the Maasai, is an art form in terms of its colour and design. For the Maasai every colour and the arrangement of colours in jewellery has a meaning. Members of your host Maasai family and other tribe members have been skilled in the art of making jewellery by their parents and grandparents. It is an integral part of the life of the Maasai and they will take every opportunity to adorn themselves.

Jewellery pieces are an important aspect of the rites of passage from transitions into adulthood, to marriage proposals, dowry negotiations, birth and death. It's the vibrancy of colour and design that are the hallmarks of Maasai jewellery. And during your day at the village, you will also get to witness some of the skills of the Maasai from those to do with learning how to protect oneself from predatory animals that stalk their herd to the plants and herbs which they use for medicinal purposes.






It is a total cultural tour and immersion in all things Maasai.

On this cultural tour you will also see how song and dance is part of the Masai's everyday life. You will see or rich and wonderful culture that is maintaining its traditions. And with your Maasai host leading the way your day will be punctuated by the songs and dance of the Maasai.

The village is less than 60 minutes from Nairobi and in the Maasai homelands. It's a great place to take a break from bustling Nairobi and the serenity of the magnificent valley will also help refresh your energies. A master class in all things Maasai and a day you will remember forever.

Karen Blixen's love affair with Kenya was captured in her autobiographical published in 1937 and made famous by the movie out of Africa that was filmed in Kenya in the mid 1980's. This tour captures the essence of those colonial times and a romantic era for Africa which captured the attention of the world. It provides a vivid snapshot of African colonial life in the last decades of the British Empire.

### Day 1

#### Visitina Karen Blixen's Home

The home of Karen Blixen was the centre and one of the largest coffee plantations of its era in Kenya. Her home in the suburb that carries her name, is now a museum showcasing her life. The original property covered 6,000 acres (2,400 ha) of land: 600 acres (240 ha) were used for a coffee plantation, 3,400 acres (1,400 ha) were used by the natives for grazing, and 2,000 acres (810 ha) of virgin forest were left untouched.

Karen and her husband became convinced that coffee would be profitable.] The Karen Coffee Company was established by their uncle, Aage Westerholz, who chose the name after his daughter Karen, Blixen's cousin, rather than to create an association with Karen Blixen. The coffee plantation was untimely unsuccessful and as Karen's marriage crumbled, she ultimately took over the management of the plantation.



Karen Blixen was an internationally acclaimed author whose pen name was Isak Dinesen and who chronicled her 17 years in Kenya in her autobiographical book, Out of Africa (published in 1937). She had spent from 1914 to 1931 in British East Africa and her story was made famous in the same named movie over 50 years later.

Karen Blixen was a Baroness who gained the title after marrying Baron Bror Blixen-Finecke in Mombasa in 2014. She was nominated for a Noble Prize in Literature several times. Two of her books Babettes Feast' and Out of Africa were made into Hollywood movies to critical acclaim. She was also a very well-known and talented critist as well.

Karen left Kenya in 1931 not long after dealing with the loss of her lover Denys but also the failure of her coffee plantation. She remained inexplicably linked to the country and the Ngong Hills. As a recent commentary states "Karen's unbearable longing for Africa, her farm and her employees never faltered through all the long years since. In a letter to her mother, she wrote: 'I have a feeling that wherever I may be in the future, I will be wondering whether there is rain at Ngona!

On the 7th of September 1962: Karen Blixen died after a long illness at her family home in Denmark. And quoting from Nicky Fitzgerald, "All she owned of Africa, a handful of earth she'd brought back with her to Denmark in a little wooden box, was mixed with the soil of Rungstedlund in her grave. The unadorned tombstone of Isak Dinesen, the world-famous author, is inscribed simply 'Karen Blixen." It was one of the most moving places I have ever visited."













In a letter to her brother Thomas in 1924, Karen Blixen wrote: "I believe that for all time and eternity I am bound to Denys, to love the ground he walks upon, to be happy beyond words when he is here, and to suffer worse than death many times when he leaves..." Denys Finch Hatton was a big game hunter and entrepreneur, who flew his own plane and had a reputation for an adventurous and daring life. He was the epitame of the colonial period. And he was flying his plane when it crashed in Voi near Mombasa. The manner of his death only added to his reputation as an adventurer with a great jest for life. He had expressed a desire to be buried in the same place that Karen had planned for herself in the Ngong Hills. It was Karen Blixen who organised his burial.

Karen Blixen and Denys Finch Hatton had been part of a group of ex-pats known for their wealth and lifestyle. They merely epitomised a period when East Africa was the playground for royalty, titled and wealthy. It offered an escape or as Karen Blixen wrote, "Here at long last one was in a position not to give a damn for all conventions, here was a new kind of freedom which until then one had only found in dreams!" Denys Finch Hatton had come from a titled English family and the current titles continue in his family to this day. On the 14th of May 1931, Denys perished in an air crash and is buried, as he wished, in the Ngong Hills. Karen Blixen had him interred at their 'special place'.

#### The Final Restina Place

As Karen noted in her biography "There was a place in the Hills, on the first ridge in the Game Reserve, that I, myself at the time when I thought that I was to live and die in Africa, had pointed out to Denys as my future buriol-place. In the evening, while we sat and looked at the hills from my house, he remarked that then he would like to be buried there himself as well. Since then, sametimes when we drove out in the hills. Denys had said: "Let us drive as far as our graves."

In 1974 his British family erected the obelisk in his memory and visit Kenya regularly – honouring their son, brother, and uncle.



#### Visiting Ngong Hills Which Karen Loved

Ngong Hills, which Karen's coffee plantation skirted, was a source of great pleasure for Karen Blixen as well as Denys Finch Hatton.

The Ngong Hills is an area of great beauty and it was a place that she retreated to often. It was a source of inspiration to Karen Blixen because of its sheer beauty and the diversity of its flora and fauna. And it was the place that she chose, and which was supposed to be, her final resting place. Denys Finch Hatton also endorsed the same place to be with Karen. The magnificent vistas dominate the landscape as much today as they did in Karen and Deny's day.

And on this excursion, we take you to the peak of the Ngong Hills to stand in the same place where Karen stood and to see the same amazing valley's and hills that she loved so much. You will be as inspired as Karen was. And it's also a photo opportunity to recreate the same amazing scenes that were so beautifully captured in the movie. A lifetime memory!

#### Visiting A Maasai Elder Who Became an Extra Hollywood Comes To Ngong Hills

Less than 20 minutes from the vista which you will enjoy is an adjacent valley that is part of the Ngong Hills. It is another magical place of extreme beauty but where acacia trees dominate in a traditional African landscape.


Driving through the foothills our destination is to meet up with a Maasai elder who was in several scenes that were shot for the film. The arrival of Hollywood, with all the supporting crew and activity involved many of the locals. And the scenes were shot less than 1000 yards from where your Maasai hosts live. A picturesque valley that epitomises the beauty of Africa.





### Day 1

#### Nairobi to Laikipia

On the first morning of this tour we pick you up from your Nairobi hotel and transfer you to Wilson Airport for the 45-minute flight to Nanyuki, which is a small town in the scenic foothills of magnificent snow-capped Mount Kenya. We then arrive at our comfortable camp in eastern Laikipia, about a two-hour drive north of Nanyuki, which is your home for the next four nights. Laikipia lies northeast of the Great filt Valley and is a vast high plateau where landowners and conservationists have created a special place for communities and wildlife to coexist, and it is recognised as one of Kenya's best safari regions.

Our peaceful camp looks westward toward a series of granite kapjes (outcrops of rock), and in the foreground you might see zebra, giraffe and antelope on the open grasslands. The camp features six lovely and spacious walk-in traditional safari tents decorated with colourful African furnishings and fabrics, and our home-cooked food is always varied, fresh and tasty. In the evenings we have drinks, or sundowners, overlooking the bush or by the fire and three-course dinners under the stars.

#### Day 2 - 4

#### Laikipia

Away from roads and vehicles, guests have a unique opportunity to take leisurely walking safaris around the camp and conservancy and take in the wide-open spaces and wildlife that Laikipja is famed for. These might include eland, hartebeest, steenbok, giraffe, Grevy's zebra and buffalo and lucky visitors may even see spot elephants, lions and wild dags. Each walking safori is tailor-made to suit the guests' abilities and you walk for as long as you feel comfortable, and you will also be accompanied by camels that carry your heavier cameras, refreshments and day-packs.

You will also learn about the local ecosystems and traditions from the Laikipia Samburu and Maasai guides. Or, if you prefer, stay at camp and let the wildlife come to you, and there are wonderful views across the plains from your tent and a salt lick right beside the camp. Other activities include game-viewing by vehicle along the Ewaso Ngiro River, which is an excellent spot to watch elephants and other animals come to drink, rock-climbing in the kopjes, and as the area has a very rich traditional culture, there's the option to visit a local market where all the warriors and women come dressed in their finest adornments.

#### Day 5

#### Laikipia - Nairobi

After breakfast and a hearty goodbye from the camp team, enjoy the last drive in Laikipia back to the airport at Nanyuki, and after your flight arrive at your Nairobi hotel in the early evening. This will be your base for the next three nights to go on three inspiring day trips to meet some remarkable communities in the rural areas around Nairobi. Tonight, and on the next two nights, we enjoy dinner at a restaurant the locals love in Nairobi – we always choose somewhere interesting to eat and have lots of fun and it's a great apportunity to discuss and ask us all the questions that come to mind about the various communities and projects we wist.














#### Day 6

#### Women's Empowerment Centre

Today we visit the Women's Empowerment Centre in a developing area in the west of Nairobi, which is one of the worthwhile projects One Horizon supports. It was started by Mary a social worker, who developed a program to help struggling mothers by teaching them lifestyle, trade, and entrepreneurial skills so they can set up their own businesses. The results have been phenomenal as the mothers are able to transform into independent business owners and community leaders, and crucially support and keep their families together. Spend time with Mary to learn about her vision and meet some of the proud and resourceful women. The experience will show you how teaching empowerment and skills can lift people out of poverty.

#### Day 7

#### Kikuyu Grandmothers

There are many grandmother-headed households in Kenya who care for their grandchildren among other generations of their family in difficult economic circumstances. Today you visit a rural Kikuyu community of delightful and resourceful grandmothers who will show you their jois-farming operation.

This is another project that One Horizon supports, and the initiative aims at improving the livelihoods of the grandmothers by economically empowering them through small-scale farming. Sit down with the grandmothers while they cook traditional meals for their families, enjoy some joyful singing and dancing, and listen to them narrate their powerful stories about pragress and resilience.


#### Day 8

#### Maasai Villaae

Today we venture into rural Maasai country where you will meet a family and immerse yourself in the midst of the daily hustle and bustle of village life. Your host will be one of the village elders, an heir to his clan, who will take you on a tour to explain how the Maasai have managed these preclous lands for centuries. The women will offer to dress you in traditional Maasai shuka clath or 'African blanker', and the young men, or morans, will explain what it's like being a warrior in Maasai society and show you how to throw a traditional spear and the techniques needed to survive in the bush. There will be singing and dancing, which might include the extraordinary jumping dance, or 'adumu' which is how Maasai warriors demonstrate their prowess.

After an exciting final day on this 8-day Kenyan Communities and Wildlife Conservation tour, we return to Nairobi where the tour ends.

Please Note: This 8-day tour can equally operate in reverse if you so choose – the three-day community visits can be first, followed by the return flight to Nanyuki and the four-day safari in Laikipia.

This spacious suite has a traditional living area with armchairs and an open fireplace, colonial furnishings, artworks, flowers from our aarden and a marble bathroom with a classic roll-top bath. The suite's private terrace is a cool and tranquil space to relax, or a setting for a romantic private dinner.

### Tented Cottage

Ololos three tented cottages provide quests with a bush experience, sleeping under a traditional makuti thatch roof, with canvas and stone walls. These safari-style kina-sized rooms are nestled amonast Ololos aardens with it's shady acacia trees. All have private terraces that overlook the national park.

# The Family Wing (Sleeps 5)

Ololo's Family Wing overlooks the Nairobi National Park with a private sunny stone terrace and potted leafy plants. Upstairs is a king-sized bedroom in a cosy mezzanine area, with a delightful en-suite bathroom and an old classic bath under makuti thatch. Downstairs is a family area and sleeping space with a second bathroom and kitchenette. The Family Wing comfortably sleeps five people.

Located in a stone-clad tower with a balcony and a private rooftop terrace, the Tower Room has extensive views right across the park, and to the famed Naona Hills. This contemporary suite is light and airy and furnished with pieces of furniture made by our clever fundi carpenters, in the Ololo workshop.

### Stable Cottage - Min 4 persons (Sleeps 6, 2 Bathrooms)

This delightful three-bedroom cottage was once the farm's hay shed. Now featuring modern, light-filled interiors the Stable Cottage sleeps a maximum of six guests, has two bathrooms, a kitchen, and a large outdoor terrace. The cottage is perfect for families, groups, or extended stays.

# The Old Stable (6 Rooms)

The original stone-walled stables of the property once housed the horses of the Ololo farm. The Stable Rooms have ensuite bathrooms and small pergola covered terraces at the front of the building. These charming rooms are popular with quests traveling as a group or for family members who wish to be accommodated close to each other





### Day 1

#### Nairobi-Ololo Safari Lodge & Farm

Today you will be picked up from your Nairobi hotel, or from Jomo Kenyatta International Airport or Wilson Airport, and transferred to Ololo Safari Lodae & Farm located just outside the southern boundary of Nairobi National Park, Originally an old Kenyan homestead and now owned by an Australian farming family, Ololo is an ideal partner for One Horizon as we share the same values, and the lodge promotes eco-friendly principles, protects local wildlife populations, farms using organic and sustainable methods, and supports the social and economic welfare of its staff and local communities. The lodge boasts a tranquil garden setting on the Mbagathi River where you can watch animals come down to drink and enjoy breath-taking views over the park and distant Ngong Hills. Individually decorated rooms are in the old farmstead, former stables or tented cottages, and there's a refreshing swimming pool. atmospheric fire-pit in the garden, and guest lounge in the thatched farmhouse with open fireplace, wine cellar and library. On your first evening, enjoy dinner on the restaurant's open-air terrace which serves a delicious menu of organic seasonal ingredients and vegetables from the farm.

### Day 2

# Early morning game drive–Sheldrick Wildlife Trust elephant orphanage–Ololo farm tour

Ololo Safari Lodge & Farm borders the 117-sq- km Nairobi National Park and this morning you'll go on your first early morning game drive to view Kenya's spectacular wildlife. It's the world's only national park that shares a boundary with a bustling capital city and features diverse landscapes ranging from broad savannah grasslands to pockets of riverine woodlands and dramatic rocky gorges. It's home to over 100 species of mammals including a large population of black and white rhino, Cape buffalo, giraffe, lion, leopard, hyeno, zebra, jackal, and antelope such as eland, hartebeest and impala.

After an exciting game drive, it's back to Ololo for a hearty breakfast. The lodge prides itself on serving excellent farm-to-table food and your plate will be filled with fresh produce; eggs, mushrooms, milk and yoghurt, fruit and vegetables are all produced using organic farming practices. Then there will be a late morning visit to the nearby Sheldrick Wildlife Trust that also occupies a site on the edge of Nairobi National Park. This pioneering elephant apphanage was founded in 1977 by Daphne Sheldrick in memory of her husband and naturalist David Sheldrick, and today the trust is the most successful baby elephant rescue and rehabilitation programme in the world. Your time here watching the advantable and endearing young calves come out for their morning play and both time will be unforgettable, and the keepers will explain their individual stories and more about the challenges elephants are exposed to in Kenya.

Returning from the Sheldrick Trust, enjoy a delicious lunch at Ololo and then while away the afternoon relaxing on the terrace or open lounge with a drink.

Alternatively go on an interesting form tour to wander through the shambas and orchards and visit the free-range livestock, and children will especially enjoy the farmyord animals. Ololo is proud of its sustainable techniques such as water-recycling, composting systems, production of natural fertilizer, and all its farm produce has been awarded wholly organic by the Kenya Organic Agriculture Network (KOAN). An additional game drive in Nairobi National Park can be arranged in the late afternoon if you wish, followed by another scrumptious dinner of food you perhaps have just seen growing on the farm on your tour.

#### Day 3

#### Early morning game drive-Maasai village excursion

Lying only 7-km away from the city centre, Nairobi National Park is fenced along its northern perimeter but is open to the south along the Embakasi and Athi rivers allowing migrating herds, and the predators that follow them, to come and go freely. On today's early morning game drive, you'll be able to photograph the unique sight of herds of zebra, giraffe and antelope peacefully grazing on the open grassy plains studded with flat-topped acacia trees with a view of Nairobi's skyscrapers on the horizon.

After breakfast back at Ololo Safari Lodge, we spend the rest of the day connecting with Kenya's proud Maasai people in an authentic and interactive way by becoming part of the hustle and bustle of Maasai village life. Having maintained a semi-nomadic way of life on their communal lands for centuries, the Maasai are well-known for their distinctive dress, valued customs and unique social and family structures, which include rites of passage and revered respect for elders. This fun and insightful day starts with a song and dance welcome where the wife of a village elder will offer to dress you in traditional Maasai shuka cloth or 'African blanket', then you'll take part in the rituals of the young warriors, perform daily tasks with the women, and sit with the villagers as they share their stories and folklore while the women teach you how to make some traditional decorative beaded jewellery; you can also purchase Maasai jewellery and curios produced by the villagers. Lunch is a delightful picnic basket prepared by Ololo Safari Lodge, and after the Maasai village excursion is another opportunity to go on a late afternoon game drive in Nairobi National Park. Then later dine under the trees or on the terrace, or on cooler nights, inside with small braziers (iikos) keeping you warm and cosy.

### Day 4

# Early morning game drive-Go Granny Go! Excursion to a Kikuyu village

The first couple of hours after dawn are always best for game-viewing, and on today's early morning drive in Nairobi National Park, as well as the large animals, keep eyes peeled for the more than 520 species of endemic and migratory birds-the highest number recorded than any other park in Kenya. Notable birds include the kori bustard, secretary bird, Maasai astrich, and the park is well known as a habital for falcons, eagles and other large birds of prey. In the dams, ponds and rivers, Nile crocodiles and hippos are present too.

After breakfast at Ololo you will visit a project that is turning around the lives of grandmas in a Kikuyu community. We at One Horizon call it the 'Go Granny Go!' tour as you meet some engaging and entrepreneurial grandmothers who are beating their generational cycle of poverty.













Many Kenyan grandmothers play a vital role in raising their grandchildren and extended families, and you'll visit a pig farm, which is a project supported by One Horizon and travellers like yourself to improve the livelihoods of grandmothers by empowering them through small-scale farming. They invite you to assist with farming activities, join in some joyful singing and dancing over a cup of local tea or chai, and by sharing lots of laughter and listening to their inspirational stories, you'll get a real insight into the strength and resilience of these remarkable Kenyan women.





The Sheldrick Wildlife Trust is renowned for its work rescuing and rehabilitating orphaned baby elephants. From 11am to 12pm, you will spend an unforgettable hour with the nursery herd. Keepers are on-hand to introduce you to each of the elephants, sharing their unique rescue stories and explaining the threats facing elephants.

#### Lunch at Galleria Shopping Center (1-2 pm)

After your visit to the elephant orphanage, we stop at one of Nairobi's most vibrant shopping centres for lunch at Art Caffe. Art Caffe has an international menu and there is something for everybody.

#### The Giraffe Centre (3.00 – 4.00 pm)

The Giraffe Centre is a Kenyan non-profit organisation. Its main purpose is to educate people on Kenya's wildlife and environment.














#### Day 5

#### One Horizon's Women Centre (11 -1pm)

You will spend a half day visit on your community adventure with some amazing Kenyan women who have managed to overcome the most difficult challenges that life can bring.

You will visit a Women's Empowerment Centre where local women in the area undertake an 18-month program that teaches them lifestyle, trade and entrepreneurial skills so they can set up their own businesses.

#### Scenic Lookout (1.30 - 3pm)

From the Women's Center we will head the short distance to the most amazing views over Nairobi and the Rift Valley. The lookout is also the site of Kenya's only working wind farm and the touring wind turbines provide energy to the local community.

### Day 6

# Mamba Village - Nairobi's Crocodile Farm (10.15 – 11.30am)

The name Mamba is Swahili for Crocodile. This is home to around 70 Nile crocodiles that are known to be the largest of the crocodile species and the most dangerous. There are five crocodile pens in the farm.

#### Kazuri Beads (12.00 - 1 pm)

Kazuri beads is a fair trade success story in Nairobi that dates back to 1975, when it was founded. Kazuri was the brainchild of Lady Susan Wood. She began with two local women who made ceramic beads by hand – the word "kazuri" means "small and beautiful" in Swahilli. Today, Kazuri employs more than 300 women.

#### Day 7

#### Lake Naivasha and Sopa Lodge (10am - 3 pm)

Sopa resort is not only home to resident giraffe, waterbuck and both Vervet and Colobus monkeys, but it is also a night stop for the hippos when they leave the lake every night to come and trim the grass on the lodge's expansive lawns. After a great lunch at the lodge, its then time to take in the wildlife that call the lodge home.

### Day 8

#### All Things Maasai (11am – 2pm)

Today you will venture into rural Maasai country where you will meet a Maasai family and immerse yourself in the midst of the daily hustle and bustle of Maasai village life. And for some of your time at the village you will be seated with the family in their manyatta (a mud home built by the women).

You will learn about their traditional rites of passage while also discovering the intricacies of the Maasai family structure.

### Day 9

#### Helping at a Soup Kitchen (10.30 – 1pm)

Today you will visit a children's centre on the outskirts of Nairobi which provides the children with their only regular meal each day. You lend a hand by helping to prepare and distribute nutritious food, and will witness firsthand how communities work together to help the hungry and most vulnerable.
